Before you start:

To register for the Co-ordinated Arts Program (CAP), you will need to know:

- a) Your registration date
- b) Your Campus-Wide Login (CWL) and password. If you don't have a CWL yet, click <u>here</u> to create one.

Now you are ready to register:

- 1. Go to the UBC Student Service Centre website.
- 2. Once on the website, click the **Cogin** button in the middle of your page.



3. Then enter your Campus-Wide Login and password.



If an STT is required for your program, you must register for an STT before adding individual courses. If you are registered in a fixed STT, you will not be permitted to drop sections in the STT. If you are registered in a variable STT, you may drop sections which you do not require.
